Chapter I Introduction

1 The Law on Arbitration

a The Law On International Commercial Arbitration

The Law of the Russian Federation, On International Commercial Arbitration, 7 July 1993, entered into effect on 12 August 1993 and was based on the UNCITRAL Model Law on International Commercial Arbitration of 1985 (the "Model Law"). Before 2015 it was amended only once, by the Federal Law of the Russian Federation of 3 December 2008, No. 250-FZ, which amendment was technical and did not affect the substance of that law. However, as of 1 September 2016,
